WHAT'S ON THE COVER?

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

Talk about the perfect combo of salty-sweet deliciousness. That's exactly what the Maple Bacon Doughnut at Nord's Bakery is. There are even city tours that bring guests to get it. Admission is free, Bar at BLU is located in the Louisville Marriott Downtown, 280 W. Jefferson St.



Satisfy your sweet tooth with a scoop of Bourbon Ball ice cream from Comfy Cow. You're in Bourbon Country, after all. For the kiddos, you can't go wrong with the downright delicious Cookie Monster Dough flavor. Get a scoop for under \$4, various locations, visit www.thecomfycow.com for details.

Enjoy side-splitting laughs at the **Backroom Comedy Show** every Thursday night at Impellizzeri's downtown location. 



Thousands of people all across the globe, including some of the biggest names in Hollywood, mark their calendars for a trip to Louisville on the first Saturday in May.

The Kentucky Derby is truly the "Most Exciting Two Minutes in Sports." Basketball legend Magic Johnson once referred to the two-week Kentucky Derby Festival as "the Super Bowl and Mardi Gras rolled into one." For many folks, it's even a bucket-list item.

However, if you can't join us for the Run for the Roses, here's how you can still get a Derby Experience all year long in Louisville.



Live Horse Racing - Enjoy live thoroughbred racing during the Spring and Fall meets at Churchill Downs. Grab a seat on the swanky Millionaire's Row, stroll through the Paddock to get an up-close view of horses and sip on a Mint Julep, all while betting on the ponies. Experience horse racing under the stars during one of the Downs After Dark events.

Drink a Mint Julep -It might be the official drink of the Kentucky Derby, but the Mint Julep isn't just reserved for the track. You can also find them year round at the bars and restaurants along Louisville's Urban Bourbon Trail.

OLD FASHIONED IS FOREVER HIP WITH LOUISVILLE **MIXOLOGISTS**

Louisville's iconic drink is the Old Fashioned, yet the clever riffs on this classic concocted by local mixologists are anything but dated. This cocktail standard is built on Bourbon, bitters, simple syrup, orange and ice. It's insanely simple yet innately flexible, and open to innovation and variation, so say our experts.

A handful of Louisville's master mixologists share their favorite way to serve an Old Fashioned, and also give the scoop on some of their other favorite drinks made with America's Native Spirit.

Pop into any of these local bars and restaurants to chat up these master mixologists (who you're likely to see whipping up Bourbon drinks behind the bar), and kick back with Louisville's Official Cocktail at the same time.

Doug Petry

Beverage Director, Rye (900 E. Market St.) and Galaxie (732 E. Market St.)

What's Rye's Old Fashioned recipe?

A quarter ounce of Demerara syrup, three dashes Angostura bitters, two dashes Regan's orange bitters and two ounces of Bulleit Bourbon. Ours is definitely spicier than some.

How do you convince a Bourbon newcomer to have an Old Fashioned?

We never have to sell our customers on an Old Fashioned. Everyone's looking for that because it's the best intro to a whiskey cocktail you can have.

Bar manager, Volare Italian Ristorante (2300 Frankfort Ave.)

What's Volare's Old Fashioned recipe?

Two ounces of rye or Bourbon, two dashes Angostura bitters, one dash of Regan's orange bitters, then depending on the sweetness of the spirit, one-quarter to one-half ounce of simple syrup. If it's a high-rye Bourbon, a bit more syrup. Stir that in a mixing glass with ice, then pour over fresh ice in a rocks glass. Garnish with an orange slice.

What's your recommendation for someone who's a beginner Bourbon drinker?

If they want to try Bourbon but want something different, I go with (book author) Jeffrey Morganthaler's Amaretto Sour. It uses just a touch of Bourbon, and it's a good cocktail to expand people's horizons.

How does a microbrewery do its Old Fashioned?

We offer multiple types. One is the Old Fashioned Experience. I make an Old Fashioned ice sphere that has brown sugar, a spiced, smoked Bourbon barrel cherry, cherry juice and an orange spiral inside. Then the guest chooses whatever Bourbon they want, and they pour it over the sphere. The drink changes as it melts.

What are your other favorite Bourbon drinks to recommend?

I'm a huge fan of a Manhattan, so we make a Smoked Manhattan in which we really do smoke the Bourbon.

What's Down One's Old Fashioned recipe?

A sugar cube in a cocktail stirrer, five to seven drops of Regan's orange bitters, muddle it and top with two ounces of our proprietary (barrel picked) Bourbon. Add a little ice, stir about ten seconds - I like some sugar granules left in the bottom of the glass. Put a sphere of ice into a rocks glass, and then add the mixture and three to four drops of Angostura bitters and an Amarena cherry. Finish it by flaming an orange peel over the glass.

If a guest doesn't want an Old Fashioned, what's your backup plan?

I suggest a smoked Old Fashioned. As soon as I pull out a blowtorch, they're usually down with it! If they don't want that, I'll suggest a Manhattan or a Boulevardier.

THE OLD FASHIONED IS ALWAYS IN FASHION



In a city that loves to celebrate Bourbon, it's only fitting that we have an official cocktail made with America's Native Spirit. In June 2015, the Old Fashioned was declared the Official Cocktail of Louisville, which makes us one of the few cities in the world to have its very own libation. The Old Fashioned is the quintessential choice since the Pendennis Club in downtown Louisville has claimed its invention since the 1880s.

Louisville even has its own celebration dedicated to its official cocktail. Old Fashioned Fortnight, which kicked off in 2015, is a two-week extravaganza that takes place in June and pays tribute to the legendary drink with several Bourbon-themed events around the city.

While you're visiting, be sure to pop into one of the city's more than 30 Urban Bourbon Trail stops (a cocktail and culinary tourism experience) and order up an Old Fashioned. Our bartenders serve them up Pendennis-style (traditional) or with their own twist.

Or, you can take home one of these fun souvenirs celebrating the drink.



LET THE GOOD TIMES POUR

While you're visiting, order up one of these classic local cocktails at one of the city's Bourbon bars or restaurants. Cheers!



MANHATTAN

Ingredients: Kentucky Bourbon, sweet vermouth and a cherry

Sip on this: Popular history suggests that the drink originated at the Manhattan Club in New York City in the early 1870s. Socialite Jenny Jerome asked the bartender to mix a special cocktail for New York Gov. Samuel J. Tilden. Another legend says that a bartender with the last name Black invented the Manhattan at a bar on Broadway in NYC in the 1860s. Whatever its origin, the Manhattan has remained a popular drink and has earned the title "King of Cocktails" among its many admirers. Over the years, there have been many variations on how to make the perfect Manhattan. The Dry Manhattan is rumored to have been a favorite drink of Frank Sinatra and the Rat Pack.

SEELBACH COCKTAIL

Ingredients: Kentucky Bourbon, Triple sec, Angostura and Peychaud's bitters and champagne

Sip on this: The Seelbach Cocktail is named for the Louisville hotel where it was created in 1917 when champagne accidentally overflowed into a Manhattan at the bar. However, it disappeared during Prohibition when the hotel was not allowed to serve it. Without a speakeasy, the recipe was lost until it was rediscovered in 1995.





MINT JULEP

Ingredients: Kentucky Bourbon, simple syrup (sugar, water and mint sprigs), crushed ice and frest mint sprig garnish


Sip on this: The exact origins of the Mint Julep are unknown, but it is said to have originated in the Southern United States during the 18th century. U.S. Sen. Henry Clay of Kentucky introduced the drink to Washington D.C. at the Round Robin Bar in the famous Willard Hotel. The Mint Julep was also the favorite drink of American author William Faulkner. It's perhaps best known as the official drink of the Kentucky Derby, an honor it has held since 1938. Churchill Downs pours more than 120,000 of them for Derby fans each year.

OLD FASHIONED

Ingredients: Kentucky Bourbon, Angostura bitters, a splash of water, sugar, maraschino cherry and an orange wedge

Sip on this: The Pendennis Club (a private club in downtown Louisville) has long claimed the invention of the Old Fashioned in the 1800s. As the story goes, a guest at the bar ordered a cocktail, but warned the bartender that he didn't like Bourbon. The bartender, not wanting to serve a non-Bourbon drink in Bourbon Country, concocted a drink that delighted the customer and still delights to this day. The drink was popularized by club member and Bourbon distiller, Col. James E. Pepper, when he introduced it to the Waldorf Astoria Hotel in New York City. It was also said to be a favorite cocktail of President Harry S. Truman and his wife Bess. The Old Fashioned enjoyed a renewed popularity with the cocktail renaissance and is the signature drink of such fictional characters as "Mad Men's" Don Draper.



LEARN ABOUT PROHIBITION IN KENTUCKY

"Spirits of the Bluegrass: Prohibition and Kentucky" is an exhibit on display at the Frazier History Museum that explores how Bourbon shaped Kentucky by tracing the rise of the anti-liquor movement from 1920 through the repeal of the 18th amendment in 1933. It spotlights how millions of otherwise law-abiding Americans chose to violate the national alcohol ban and details the vast, often violent, criminal industry that quickly sprang up to quench the country's thirst for illegal booze.


A highlight of the exhibit is a Bourbon barrel that visitors can simulate dumping Prohibition-style. The exhibit space also features two full-sized bars and an event-ready speakeasy. The Kentucky Distillers' Association (KDA) is the title sponsor for the exhibition, which is on display at the Frazier through 2016.







Chef and co-owner, Anoosh Bistro (4864 Brownsboro Rd.). Shariat's highly innovative cuisine reflects countless international influences and his own unique flair.

Breakfast: I'm vegetarian, so I look for such dishes. I like a lot of places, but the scrambled tofu with avocado at Zeggz (4600 Chamberlain Ln.) is a favorite. I also like grilled cheese and good hash

Lunch: Heart & Soy (1216 Bardstown Rd.) if I can sneak out. It's a vegetarian restaurant, so anything on the menu.

Dinner: When I do get out, I like pizza at Coal's Artisan Pizza (3730 Frankfort Ave.).

What you crave: The jicama spring roll at Heart & Soy. It is delicious and has some heat to it. I also love the pho there. Oh, and the potato dosa at Dakshin (4742 Bardstown Rd.).

Dinner: The cochinita pibil at **Mayan Café** (813 E. Market St.) and sushi at **Masa Japanese Bistro & Sushi Bar** (12336 Shelbyville Rd.), which is amazing and so fresh.

What you crave: Oh, easy, pistachio gelato from Gelato Gilberto (9434 Norton Commons Blvd.).

Drinks: Jack's Lounge (122 Sears Ave.) for wine or Scotch.

Peng Looi

Chef and co-owner, **Asiatique** (1767 Bardstown Rd.). Some of the city's finest Asian-fusion cuisine is created here by this self-taught Malaysian chef.

Lunch: The Irish Rover (2319 Frankfort Ave.) for fish and chips. I used to live on them when I was in high school in England. I also like **Stout Burgers & Beers** (1604 Bardstown Rd.).

Dinner: I go to my chef friends' places to see them. We went to **Artesano** (1321 Herr Ln.) recently, and my daughter chose **Anoosh Bistro** (4864 Brownsboro Rd.) for her birthday.

What you crave: Malaysian food, and I cook it for my family on my day off. A good Malaysian dish at **Asiatique** is beef rendang (simmered with coconut, cardamom and clove).

Dallas McGarity

Executive chef and partner at Marketplace Restaurant (651 4th St.). Rooted firmly in Southern food traditions, McGarity's food is also fused with Asian influences.

Breakfast: Sunday brunch at **El Camino** (1314 Bardstown Rd.). Their chilaquiles are killer.

Lunch: I like Mussel & Burger Bar (9200 Taylorsville Rd. and 113 S. 7th St.), especially the big, fat (steak) fries.

Dinner: I was recently at **Decca** (812 E. Market St.) and was blown away. (Chef) Annie (Pettry) is just killing it. Her fresh pastas are my favorite. They're so creative and innovative.

What you crave: Marketplace's Philly Cheesesteak done with 48-hour cooked short ribs on a pretzel bun with banana peppers.

Drinks: The Brown Hotel's Lobby Bar (335 W. Broadway). They stay open really late and it's a cool people-watching space.



Regardless of our city's ever-diversifying restaurant offerings, the one dish, that must-have, "I ate this in Louisville" meal is the Hot Brown - a hot and hearty, saucy and savory single-serving top-tier tantalizer of the taste buds.

Though the original version was created at The Brown Hotel nearly a century ago, this oven-baked, open-faced sandwich of roast turkey, toast, bacon, tomato and cheese sauce has micro-evolved into many forms using essentially the same ingredients. Many local chefs and restaurants have put their own spin on Louisville's official sandwich.

Here are five ways to eat a Hot Brown in Louisville:

A CULT CLASSIC

The hallowed birthplace of the Hot Brown is The Brown Hotel. Legend says it was created in the 1920s by chef Fred Schmidt, who wanted to keep crowds as large as 1,200 on premises after dances. Who needs pre-dawn bacon and eggs when you can get an open-faced hot sandwich of turkey, bacon, tomato, toast and cheese sauce?

An instant hit, the Hot Brown was oft-replicated around the town's homes and restaurants, sometimes done well, others, not so much. Thankfully, Schmidt's successors have carried the torch for the famous dish.

Knowing the gravity and honor given the Hot Brown, the hotel's executive chef, Josh Bettis said to a reporter before he even asked the question, "No, I'm not going to change the Hot Brown. I'd be a fool to mess with a classic." And you'd be foolish not to try it. It's available daily in the hotel's J. Graham's Café.

HOT BROWN PIZZA

Given the bread base in a Hot Brown, it's not a stretch to conjure up a pizza version. That's what Sicilian Pizza and Pasta did several years ago, and now the house specialty is one of its most popular pies. The Hot Brown Pizza uses a cream sauce base with cheddar and mozzarella cheeses, turkey, bacon and tomatoes atop that, and it's finished with a sprinkling of a secret herb blend.

"We have tours that come in here to get it," says owner Chris Koppel. "We do a lot of caterings where people order it, too."

LOUISVILLE'S CYCLING SCENE IS ON A ROLL

Louisville's got the pedal to the metal when it comes to being one of the country's best cycling cities. USA Today called us one of the 10 Best Bike-Friendly Cities and Paste named Louisville one of the Midwest's Best Mountain Bike Destinations. And, recently a biking attraction that owns the bragging rights to being the first of its kind in the world made its debut in Louisville.

MEGA UNDERGROUND BIKE PARK (at Louisville Mega Cavern) is located 100 feet underground and features over 45 trail lines covering more than 320,000 square feet. Jump lines, pump tracks, dual slalom, BMX, cross country and single track are all housed in the former limestone cavern, which is also home to Mega Zips and Mega Quest. Adding to the cool factor is that cyclists can ride year round because the cavern is always naturally 60 degrees. The bike park is ideal for all ages and skill levels, from BMX, dirt and mountain bike enthusiasts to casual and cyclocross riders. And if you don't have a bike of your own, you can

GET READY TO ROLL AT THESE OTHER LOCAL CYCLING SPOTS

BIG FOUR BRIDGE – The bicycle and pedestrian bridge spans the Ohio River and connects Louisville to Jeffersonville, Ind. The two-mile, roundtrip journey offers breathtaking views of the city, river and internationallyacclaimed Waterfront Park. Rentals are available at the bridge base on the Louisville side at Wheel Fun Rentals.

BMX TRACK AND PARK - Louisville is home to the nationally recognized BMX track at E.P. "Tom" Sawyer State Park. The park also includes 513 acres and 2.25 miles of trails (some open for bikers).

EVA BANDMAN PARK & CYCLOCROSS VENUE - Known as one of the premier cyclocross venues in the country, the course combines scenic views of downtown Louisville and the Ohio River. It boasts adventurous features like sand pits, run-ups, flyovers and wooded areas. The park played host to the 2013 UCI Masters and Elite Cyclo-cross World Championships. (Louisville was the first city outside Europe to host this event.)

DAVE ARMSTRONG EXTREME PARK - Upgraded in 2015, this worldclass skate park features 40,000 square feet of outdoor concrete skating surface. Other amenities include a 24-foot full pipe and a wooden vert ramp.

LOUISVILLE LOOP - This estimated 100-mile trail system that's in the works will eventually encircle the city and link both existing and new parks and neighborhoods to civic attractions, transportation alternatives and recreation opportunities. Check out the already completed 44.5-plus miles.

PARKLANDS AT FLOYDS FORK - Whether you're looking for a smooth, paved path or a new singletrack experience, The Parklands offers biking options for all levels of bicyclists. Visitors of this donor-supported public park can ride along the shared-use Louisville Loop, all 19 miles of which will be fully open to the public in Spring 2016. More than a dozen additional miles of soft-surface trails, ranging from beginner to advanced, offer visitors adventurous rides through valleys, hills and forests. Even more is still to come as The Parklands begins construction of a world-class mountain bike ride center in 2016.

LOU'S BREWS: LOUISVILLE'S CRAFT BEER SCENE IS HOPPING

Many in Louisville, even regular craft beer drinkers, don't realize that the city was once a major southeastern brewing hub competing with places like Milwaukee and St. Louis. During its heyday in the late 1800s and early 1900s, dozens of breweries peppered the streets.

In fact, it was difficult to walk six blocks without coming across a brewery. An influx of German immigrants saw to it that brewing was a focal point of Louisville's social and economic culture, and with them they brought German brewing traditions. This led to the introduction of lager brewing here. Also during this brewing heyday, a beer style native to Louisville known as Kentucky Common was born.

Today, Louisville's brewing scene is again on the rise. New breweries are opening each year and existing ones are raising the bar ever higher. With this growth, the Kentucky Guild of Brewers has created a guide that pinpoints the location of each Louisville brewery. Pick one up at the Louisville Visitors Center. In the meantime, here's a look at the hoppin' breweries to visit and to raise a pint in Louisville and the surrounding area.



3rd Turn Brewing is a Jeffersontown pub-style neighborhood gathering spot with 20 taps. 3rd Turn brews a variety of styles from IPAs to Belgians with unexpected twists.

@3rdturnbrewing



Located in the heart of the Upper Highlands since April 2014, Great Flood is a brewer-owned-and-operated two-barrel brewery. The small size allows for Great Flood to produce new experimental house brews every week alongside taproom staples, including Blonde, Oatmeal Stout and Double IPA. They also feature rotating guest taps to please every sort of beer drinker, from fickle to connoisseur. @GreatFloodReer

Cumberland Brews is a locally owned and operated brewpub in the Highlands offering patrons flagships such as Meade and Nitro Porter. You'll also find rotating beers from its small batch system.



Against the Grain Brewery & Smokehouse, Louisville's first brewer-ownedand-operated brewery, brews a constantly rotating spectrum of beers in the categories of hop, smoke, dark, malt, session and whim. If you come at the right time, you can also try the highly touted Bo and Luke or 35K Milk Stout. AtG just recently opened a 30-barrel production facility in Louisville's Portland neighborhood, which will increase production by more than 400 percent. @AtGBrewery

With a combined total of more than 40 years of homebrewing experience, Apocalypse Brew Works has quickly become a part of Louisville's top-notch craft beer scene and brewing tradition. Apocalypse focuses on creating small-batch, fresh craft beer with an emphasis on sustainability. @ApocalypseBrews

In the Fourth Street Live! entertainment district, swing into Gordon Biersch for an authentic German lager brewed right here in town. Gordon Biersch has embraced its Louisville location by barrel aging many of its popular beers. @Gordon Biersch



Goodwood Brewing lies in the heart of the city's NuLu district surrounded by a setting that reflects Louisville's lengthy history of brewing. In the spirit of Kentucky's Bourbon tradition, all Goodwood beers are wood-aged and brewed with pure limestone water. @GoodwoodBrewing





One of Louisville's most well-known breweries, Falls City, was selling more than a million barrels a year in its heyday. After officially closing its doors in 1978, Falls City was brought back to life in 2010 with the reemergence of its flagship, Extra Special English Pale Ale. Currently sharing a building with Old 502 Winery (Kentucky's only urban winery), Falls City offers six beers on tap ranging from the hoppy Hipster Repellent to the easygoing Wheat Ale. @FallsCityBeer

Donum Dei, which means "Gift of God" in Latin, is a brewery and pub also located in New Albany. The atmosphere was specifically designed to actually encourage conversation – you won't find any televisions or WiFi here. @DonumDeiBrewery

At the end of the Big Four Bridge in Jeffersonville, Ind., Flat 12 and Red Yeti give those willing to walk a little taste of what Indiana has to offer. Flat 12 is a rustic, yet polished, taproom featuring 32 taps and a spacious deck overlooking the Ohio River. The house beer list contains Flat 12 favorites along with unique taproom-only brews like Spirit Move Saison and loe Brahma Coffee Brown. Just a few blocks down the road, Red Yeti Restaurant and Brew Pub offers a wide variety of Indiana-brewed beers alongside its own Honey Porter and Green Pale Ale. @Flat I 2Bierwerks & @RedYetiBrewing



Bluegrass Brewing Company has been a staple in the Louisville brewing industry since 1993 and is currently Kentucky's longest continually operating brewery. Since then, BBC has developed into two separate entities: A production side and a brewpub side. **BBC Brewpubs** has three locations throughout the city where patrons can grab a pint alongside lunch or dinner. BBC Brewpubs offer an array of beers, including Dark Star Porter and the experimental Four Roses barrel-aged beers. @bbc_stmatthews

Floyd County Brewing Company is located right across the river in New Albany, Ind. At this brewpub you'll find Old World European influences in everything they do - from the food to the beers to the ambiance. @floydcountybrew



Brewing since 2004, New Albanian Brewing Company in New Albany, Ind., has boasted one of the area's most popular beer destinations at its Pizzeria and Public House, as well as styled many of its flagship brands at its Bank Street Brewhouse location. The Pizzeria and Public House is home to a research and development brewery, which features 25 beers on draft and roughly 250 bottled selections. Bank Street Brewhouse features an open-air patio, beer garden and flagship beers like Elector and Hoptimus always on draft.

@NABCOfficial & @BankStBrewHouse

Monnik is a small brewpub crafting a wide array of lagers and ales, as well as offering pub fare using locally sourced ingredients. They are also the first brewery to return to the Germantown-Schnitzelberg area. @MonnikBeer

AKASHA Brewing turns up the "funk" in Louisville's NuLu district. They utilize wild fermentation to brew several of their beers, which will create a sour or "funky" taste not seen among your traditional lagers or ales.

Right up the road is Louisville's historic Whiskey Row, an area full of history and character like NYC's Greenwich Village. Appropriately named Whiskey Row, as it was home to the Bourbon industry in Louisville, this area of Main Street is returning to its roots with sites like the Evan Williams Bourbon Experience, Peerless Distillery and more.

Nestled right on the edge of downtown is our very own Meatpacking District, Butchertown. It isn't just the name or industry that aligns these two; it's the exclusive nightlife and dining. Head to Butchertown Grocery for a mouthwatering culinary experience, but don't forget to sneak up the back stairs for a hidden craft cocktail hotspot and live music. After drinks, follow the music to Play for a night of drag shows and dancing.

Hipsters rejoice! Our local 'hoods like the Highlands and NuLu will remind you of famous Brooklyn boroughs, offering a view of local culture with coffee shops, breweries and laidback bars at every turn.

The Highlands will bring to mind Park Slope; full of historic housing, with a strip of local dining like the original farm-to-table restaurant Lilly's Bistro and local brew spots like the Holy Grale, located in an old church.



Bardstown Road, Louisville's original "Restaurant Row," is situated in the city's Highlands neighborhood. In addition to being a dining Mecca, it's also known for its eccentric collection of shops and is one of the most popular neighborhoods for local nightlife.

The area is as eclectic as it is charming. You'll find Victorian homes and turn-of-the-century architecture along quiet streets, just off bustling Bardstown Road, which is truly a people-watching paradise. Sit in a coffee shop or café and see businesspeople, creative types, families and skateboarders gliding past.

EAT

The Highlands has been a foodie haven for decades. Long-time staples, **Jack Fry's** and **Lilly's**, are favorites for locals celebrating special occasions. You can also spy celebrity chef Anthony Lamas whipping up Latin delights at **Seviche**.

Or, if you're in the mood for a more casual evening, this neighborhood is teeming with great **pizza joints** and **pubs**. (The garlic butter soaked breadsticks at **Impellizzeri's** are to die for.)

Not to mention, the bounty of local breweries and beer bars. **Great Flood** and **Cumberland Brewery** both offer their own brews, and the **Holy Grale** is the perfect place to find rare beers from around the world. One of the newest restaurants to the area is **Fontleroy's**, an eatery serving upscale pub food, named in tribute to James Fontleroy Grinstead, who was Louisville mayor from 1907 to 1909.

DISCOVER

For family fun, visit the **Louisville Zoo**. Hike, picnic or just relax at **Tyler Park** or **Cherokee Park**.

The Highlands nightlife is legendary and **neighborhood bars** are a great place to play pool, hear live music or perform karaoke.

For fans of **Holy Grale**, the adjacent **Gralehaus Bed & Breakfast** is the perfect home away from home. Louisville's only "Bed and Beverage" offers accommodations above the dining area for visitors 21 and up. On the menu, you'll find Southern-style breakfast and lunch, like biscuits and duck gravy. Or enjoy a beer cocktail in the picturesque beer garden.

SHOP

For fashionistas, several locally-owned boutiques, including **Dot Fox** and **General Eccentric**, pepper Bardstown Road. National retailer **Urban Outfitters** also calls the Highlands home. **Leatherhead** has been a popular spot for more than 30 years, with its luxurious leather goods and celebrity customers. And fans of band shirts will find their own slice of heaven at **Vintage Banana**.

BUTCHERTOWN

One of Louisville's oldest neighborhoods, Butchertown was the city's original meatpacking district with butcher shops dominating the area in the 1800s. These days, though one large meatpacker anchors the area, Butchertown is in the middle of a renaissance and is being spruced up with chic boutiques, the city's first brandy distillery and more options for shopping, dining and having fun.

EAT

Etched on the front windows of Butchertown Grocery is just an inkling of what is in store for diners - gnocchi, rotisserie, burgers and beignets - but that's not the whole story. The fine dining restaurant, that takes up residence in a historic 1800s building that was the site of a grocery store, offers American cuisine with a twist. After dinner, head upstairs to the intimate lounge and performance venue. Try one of the strikingly named cocktails such as the Peeping Tom of Butchertown.

Whet your whistle at Sergio's World of Beers with more than 1,000 options or stop by the new Louis's the Ton for a cocktail.

DISCOVER

Butchertown is home to Bourbon Country's only brandy distillery, Copper & Kings. Take a tour and enjoy a sampling of its spirits in the rooftop tasting room, which boasts gorgeous views of downtown.

The Louisville Extreme Park is the place to go for skateboarders. It features 40,000 square feet of outdoor, concrete skating surface, as well as a 24foot full pipe and a wooden vert ramp.

Experience the area's rich history at the **Thomas** Edison House, where you'll be enlightened about the inventor's time in Louisville. Or, stop by Hadley Pottery for an inside look at how the iconic stoneware is made.

Play Dance Bar may be a new kid on the block, but it is the place to be for drag shows and dance parties.

SHOP

Butchertown Market is a one-stop-shop for a little retail therapy. Cellar Door Chocolates is famous for its Bourbon truffles. Moss Hill makes handcrafted lotions, soaps and candles with specialty scents like Bourbon and Mint Julep. At Bourbon Barrel Foods, you can pick up Bourbon barrel smoked spices, small batch soy sauce aged in Bourbon barrels and specialty bitters. You'll also find locally crafted artwork and jewelry at Work the Metal, along with clothing, handbags, home décor and other one-of-a-kind gifts.

GERMANTOWN

Germantown, one of Louisville's oldest neighborhoods, was named after the influx of German immigrants who first settled there in the mid 1800s. The area is dotted by the largest collection of shotgun and camelback houses in the city. A popular local saying is that there's a dive bar on every corner. Recently, the neighborhood has become a mix of old and new, maintaining its history while welcoming hip eateries and bars.

EAT

Hammerheads' selection of house-smoked meats has attracted a following. Look for the stuffed hammerhead shark just above the entrance and you'll know you're in the right spot. Eiderdown serves up Southern cuisine with a European twist. The seasonal menu includes duck fat popcorn, spaetzle and Kentucky country ham.

Lovers of craft beer can add **Monnik Beer Co.** to their list. The brewery, taproom and restaurant offers locally sourced pub fare. And stop by **The Post** for a slice of New York-style pizza.

Check's Café has been a neighborhood tradition for more than 60 years. It's the kind of place where cold beer and inexpensive, tasty food go hand in hand. Order up a bowl of Check's Famous Chili – a tradition since 1944. Another top seller is the fried bologna sandwich served on rye bread.

Let your imagination run wild at **JB Cakes** where you design your own cupcake. Choose a cupcake, add your favorite frosting and finish with toppings. Looking for something out of the ordinary, but tastes extraordinary? Stop by **Nord's Bakery** for one of its famous maple bacon doughnuts or **Four Pegs** for a chicken and waffle sandwich.

DISCOVER

Schnitzelberg, Germantown's sister neighborhood, is home to the annual **World Dainty Championship** in July. Since 1971, this imported German game, which calls for a broomstick, the wood dainty (similar in size to sidewalk chalk, sharpened to a point at both ends) and an open street, has drawn people to **Hauck's Handy Store**. Players hit the dainty like a baseball and the farthest stick wins. Stop in Hauck's for a cold soda and ask to see the dainty behind the counter.

SHOP

At **Fat Rabbit**, you'll find clothing for men and women, accessories, electronics, art, books, knick-knacks, home goods, antiques and more. It shares space with **Astro Black Records**, a new and used record store specializing in avant-everything, small press, DIY and cassettes with a focus on vinyl LPs.

YesterNook Vintage Furniture & Collectibles is a vendor mall with more than 35 vendors offering antiques, modern furniture and home decor.

THE AVENUE

Take a stroll along Frankfort Avenue, the main thoroughfare through the leafy and charming Crescent Hill and Clifton neighborhoods. You'll find historic homes and buildings, tree-lined streets, alfresco dining and locally-owned shops galore along this railroad-lined avenue.

EAT

Start your day with a pastry, coffee or full brunch at Blue Dog Bakery, touted for its authentic artisan breads. Among the local favorites for lunch or dinner are Porcini (fine Northern Italian cuisine), Irish Rover (Irish pub grub), Bourbons Bistro (Bourbon-inspired dishes), North End Café (fine diner, traditional menu and special diet selections) and Joella's Hot Chicken.

To top off the night, the Avenue has several options. Head over to Craft House; you'll be amazed at the selection of local craft beers. The Hub Louisville is the place to catch the big game on TV and grab some pub food. Or, there's Silver Dollar. Housed in a restored 1890s firehouse, the restaurant and bar is an official Urban Bourbon Trail stop and is stocked with more than 100 Kentucky Bourbons.

In nearby Irish Hill, you'll find Le Moo, a steakhouse offering over a dozen cuts of steak, as well as lamb, chicken, seafood and pasta. When you're ready to dine in style, reserve the "Louis booth," which is made from 17 vintage Louis Vuitton bags complemented with LV logo painted walls, a period French bronze chandelier and velvet drapes.

DISCOVER

The Crescent Hill Reservoir and Gatehouse is a great place for a stroll. Visiting on the final Friday of the month? Hop on the free trolley during the Frankfort Avenue Trolley Hop to visit shops, restaurants and galleries in Crescent Hill, Clifton and Butchertown.

Stop by the American Printing House for the **Blind** for free guided tours. Witness the production of Braille publications, the recording of books and see Helen Keller's Bible.

SHOP

Consignment shops galore line Frankfort Avenue, including Margaret's Consignments and Collectibles and Elizabeth's Timeless Attire. Looking for something a little unusual? Visit Just Creations. This fair trade marketplace sells artisan handcrafted goods from over 45 countries.

If you're searching for home items or gifts with Southern charm, head to **Urban Farmhouse** Market. If you're on the hunt for designer fashions, find them at Peacock Boutique. And for specialty Bourbon enhanced culinary delights, visit Bourbon Barrel Foods.

known for unique art galleries, specialty stores, antique shops and a growing number of local restaurants. Thrillist even named NuLu one of the 18 Best Food Neighborhoods in America.

The East Market District of downtown, also referred to as NuLu (New Louisville) is becoming

EAT

For barbeque lovers, Feast BBQ is one of the hottest tickets in NuLu. For those who crave spicy food, Royals Hot Chicken would fit the bill. Once a popular food truck, Grind Burger Kitchen has set up shop for those with a craving for burgers.

Locals rave about the wok-seared lima beans from Mayan Café. The daily scone board at farmerowned Harvest is a menu must-have, and Rye is known for its American cuisine and craft cocktails.

NuLu is also home to Ghyslain on Market and Wiltshire on Market. And, at Decca, enjoy inspired food from Chef Annie Pettry, see local artwork, enjoy a cocktail on the patio and listen to live music in the Cellar Lounge.

DISCOVER

For a heart-thumping adventure, try indoor rock climbing at Climb NuLu. On the first Friday of the month, hop aboard a ZeroBus for the First Friday Hop. It's an all-in-one art show, shopping adventure and street party.

For craft brew devotees, Akasha Brewing Company and Goodwood Brewing Company are worth a stop.

Unwind at **Garage Bar** (housed in a former auto service garage) with a cold draft, bottled craft beer, Bourbon, seasonal cocktail or wine. The casual spot serves up pizzas from a wood-fired brick oven. In warm weather, ping pong tournaments are in full swing outside.

SHOP

Chaz Rough

East Market Street is peppered with local shops, including Scout (stylish home and personal accessories, artwork, jewelry and other gifts), Peace of the Earth (locally made bath products), Bermuda Highway (a boutique and record shop from Katie Toupin, member of the popular local band, Houndmouth), Muth's Candies (home of the famous Modjeska - a caramel-covered marshmallow confection) and Joe Ley Antiques (an 1890s schoolhouse filled with two acres of treasures).

Need a sugar fix while you're out shopping? Head over to Please & Thank You, home of what's touted as the world's best chocolate chip cookie. The café and record shop sells coffee, sweets, sandwiches and more. Enjoy a cup of java as you peruse the vinyl record selection.

LOUISVILLE

This neighborhood has the largest collection of restored Victorian homes in the country and is the third largest Historical Preservation District in the U.S.

Built as a suburb in the 1870s, Old Louisville consists of nearly 48 city blocks of Victorian-era homes considered the oldest, largest and most beautifully preserved homes in the city.

Amid the rich architecture of this community, you'll also find quaint bed and breakfast inns and excellent dining options, surrounded by the beauty of mature magnolia and oak trees.

EAT

610 Magnolia is considered one of the city's best restaurants. Chef-owner Edward Lee (a James Beard finalist who starred on Iron Chef America and Top Chef) blends European techniques with seasonal, local, organic products during a six-course dinner.

Buck's, an official Urban Bourbon Trail stop, combines European luxury and modern style with linen tablecloths, artfully mismatched china, white flowers adorning the bar and live piano music nightly.

A Louisville institution since 1947, Dizzy Whizz serves up breakfast, soups, sandwiches and more. Try the famous WhizzBurger, a double-decker hamburger with a secret special sauce.

DISCOVER

For lovers of the Bard, check out Kentucky Shakespeare, presenters of the oldest free Shakespeare festival in the U.S. At the Speed Art Museum, art lovers of all ages can see paintings and sculpture works from all around the world. After a major renovation, Kentucky's first museum has more than doubled its size and added an outdoor art park and piazza.

History buffs will be enthralled with the other museums in Old Louisville too - Conrad-Caldwell House and the Filson Historical Society.

For families, a fun and educational option is the Gheens Science Hall & Rauch Planetarium located on the University of Louisville campus.

Old Louisville has its own Central Park, which often functions as the center of community events. Also, check out Old Louisville's walking and bus tours with themes from architectural to ghostly.

SHOP

The first full weekend of October, Old Louisville springs to life with the St. James Court Art Show. With more than 700 exhibiting artists, it has become one of the largest juried art shows in the country.

As the city's primary retail and entertainment corridor for much of the 19th and 20th centuries, Fourth Street was the place to see and be seen.

After undergoing a recent retail revitalization, South Fourth Street has again become a trendy place for local shopping. The 500 and 600 blocks of the street have even been dubbed Sou4th. In addition to shopping, this central downtown area, is also a premier destination for dining and fun attractions.

EAT

Stop by the **Brown Hotel** to sink your teeth into the world famous Original Hot Brown, which was created at the hotel in the 1920s. For elevated views and cuisine, go to **8UP Elevated Drinkery & Kitchen**, Louisville's first open-air rooftop bar and restaurant, located on the 8th floor of the Hilton Garden Inn.

For fine dining, try **The Oakroom** at the Seelbach Hilton, Kentucky's only AAA Five-Diamond awarded restaurant. (The Seelbach served as inspiration for F. Scott Fitzgerald's *Great Gatsby*, and also hosted Al Capone in his own private card room).

Theater Square is home to over a dozen dining options, including **Marketplace Restaurant**, where Southern comfort food meets Italian flair and live jazz in an eclectic atmosphere.

DISCOVER

The **Louisville Palace**, originally a movie theater that opened in 1928, now hosts international musicians, comedians and performing arts shows. The Palace is famous for ornate baroque architecture and design. The **Mercury Ballroom** is the newest live music venue in the area. The space has already hosted acclaimed national up-and-coming artists.

Fourth Street Live! is an epicenter of nightclubs and restaurants, including Jim Beam® Urban Stillhouse, a visitor destination and small distillery, and Bourbon Raw, a Bourbon-focused restaurant with raw seafood bar.

For craft cocktail connoisseurs, **Meta** is a must. You'll find classics as well as playfully modern concoctions.

SHOP

Fill up your bags with Louisville-themed souvenirs, some with a Bourbon twist. There's **Art Eatables** (a chocolatier and confectioner known for Bourbon truffles), **Block Party Handmade Boutique** (local artist and entrepreneur work), **Gifthorse** (handmade and artisanal items), **Craft(s)** (contemporary and traditional art gallery featuring works by Kentucky and regional artists), **Regalo** (gifts, accessories, décor and fine art) and **Cellar Door Chocolates** (known for Bourbon buttercreams).

WHISKEY ROW/MUSEUM ROW

Whatever you want to call it, Louisville's Main Street has got it going on. Named one of the best Main Streets in America, it's once again a thriving Bourbon and culinary district and is also home to some of the city's most iconic attractions.

Lining Main Street are some of the oldest buildings in the city, as well as the largest collection of cast iron facades - second only to SoHo in New York City.

EAT

If it's pizza you're craving, there's Bearno's or Impellizzeri's. Got a hankering for Mexican? Me Gusta and Manny & Merle are top-notch choices. For straightforward, Southern cuisine, there's Doc Crow's Southern Smokehouse & Raw Bar.

At fusion restaurant Mussel & Burger Bar, diners will find some of the city's best gourmet burgers and a selection of Prince Edward Island mussels. For a tasty burger and a "boozy" milkshake, try Sidebar. For quick, yummy pub fare, there's O'Shea's Downtown and Troll Pub Under the Bridge. When you want fine dining, pop into Proof On Main, where fresh local and seasonal ingredients inspire the restaurant's ever-evolving menu.

DISCOVER

The Evan Williams Bourbon Experience (the first distillery to open on Main Street since Prohibition) is the first of several Bourbon-related tourist attractions on the horizon for Whiskey Row, including Angel's Envy, Michter's Distillery and Old Forester.

The KFC Yum! Center is a 22,000-seat, stateof-the-art downtown waterfront arena that continuously plays host to a who's who of musical

Museum Row on Main Street boasts 10 original attractions within 4 walkable blocks. From history to modern art, there is something for everyone. You can visit the Frazier History Museum, Glassworks, Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory, Kentucky Science Center (which is also home to the KentuckyShow!), Kentucky Museum of Art and Craft, 21c Museum Hotel, the Kentucky Center for the Performing Arts, Evan Williams Bourbon Experience and the Muhammad Ali Center.

The Museum Row attractions offer reciprocal discounts if you show your ticket from another attraction. Or, you can purchase the Main Ticket, which will get you admission into 6 attractions. It's good for an entire year.

SOUTH END

In recent years, south Louisville has experienced a renaissance. Young families have moved into this area of second-and-third-generation residents. Many have come from all across the globe. With this mix of old and new, Louisville's South End has become a multicultural community that's rich and diverse.

EAT

The area is especially well known for delicious and inexpensive international dining options such as Jerusalem Café and Vietnam Kitchen (a personal favorite of many top Louisville chefs).

Mike Linnig's has been serving up fried fish, frog legs, shrimp, pan-fried oysters, turtle soup and more since 1925. Nestled in a shady grove along the Ohio River, you can eat your seafood indoors or out, all while enjoying the view.

If you have a taste for BBQ, you'll enjoy the rustic Shack in the Back BBQ located in Fairdale.

And if you need a caffeine fix, get fueled up at Sunergos, a micro-roastery and coffee shop in the eclectic Beechmont neighborhood that also highlights local artwork.

DISCOVER

The South Points Scenic Area, along the Ohio River and surrounded by thousands of acres of forested knobs and open space, is a prime Louisville destination for outdoor recreation and cultural pursuits. Look up in the trees at the 6,500-acre Jefferson Memorial Forest and you'll find the family-friendly Go Ape! Treetop Adventure, a fun and challenging journey through zip lines, obstacles and Tarzan swings. Or find your bliss along one of the Forest's many hiking trails. If mountain biking or fishing is your thing, don't miss a visit to Waverly

South Points is also home to Iroquois Park, one of the gems of the Olmsted parks, which hosts concerts in the Iroquois Amphitheatre and is the site of the annual Jack O'Lantern Spectacular, voted by Country Living magazine as one of the Top 15 Halloween Celebrations in America.

See firsthand how Bourbon and whiskey are made from start to finish at Bulleit Frontier Whiskey Experience at Stitzel-Weller, a Kentucky Bourbon Trail® stop.

The area boasts some of the most beautiful views, with many accessible while hiking along a trail atop its many knobs or biking the Louisville Loop, which stretches from Riverside, The Farnsley-Moremen Landing through west Louisville and into downtown.

Experience the thrill and traditions of the Kentucky Derby everyday at the **Kentucky Derby Museum**, where a 360-degree high-definition multimedia show, exhibits, a café and gift shop await visitors.

PORTLAND

Located near the Ohio River on the western edge of downtown, Portland's history is deeply tied to the river. Early on, it was an independent river city that served as a port for the boats transporting goods and people around the Falls of the Ohio. Portland's bustling commercial activity attracted many new residents including Irish immigrants. Today, Portland is again attracting new businesses and residents.

FAT

For your first stop, drop by Hot Coffee for a cup of joe and a pastry. The walk-up window and bakery Please & Thank You serves up espresso drinks, oatmeal and other breakfast favorites. For lunch, try The Table Café. Everyone has a place at the table where you pay what you can afford. Run by volunteers, the non-profit restaurant serves lunch Monday through Friday.

DISCOVER

Portland's tradition of independence is exemplified in three beverage makers that call the neighborhood home - Kentucky Peerless Distilling, Falls City Brewery and Old 502 Winery. All are within minutes of the western edge of Whiskey and Museum Row.

Kentucky Peerless Distilling is again producing Bourbon after 100 years. Take a tour to see each step in the Bourbon making process. In addition to Bourbon and rye, it's also bottling Lucky Kentucky Moonshine.

Just blocks away, Falls City Brewery and Old 502 Winery share a building, taproom and gift shop. From 1905 to 1948, the brewery produced Falls City Beer, Louisville's first craft beer. Today it's brewing the 7-Barrel Series onsite. At Old 502 Winery, Kentucky's only urban winery, they use Kentucky grown grapes to make wines that reflect its spirit. For dinner, visit Over the 9, the sister restaurant of the brewery and winery.

The Portland Museum is a magnet for history buffs. Housed in a 1852 Italianate mansion, the museum tells the story of the former river town. During your tour, you'll learn about the Falls of the Ohio, Portland Wharf and how the canal was built.

Tim Faulkner Gallery is home to a 5,000-squarefoot contemporary art gallery, artists studios, 2,500seat performance space and McQuixote Books & Café. Readers will delight in the book selection at McQuixote Books & Café, including classics, hard-tofind titles and first editions. In the café, you'll have a choice of drinks, pastries and sandwiches off of the rotating menu. After hours, you'll find a full bar, and the performance space hosts community events, concerts and more. McQuixote is home to the monthly Portland Poetry Series, author readings and acoustic music shows.

MIDDLETOW

Middletown is a vibrant suburb of Louisville that has retained its small-town charm. It attracts shoppers and diners to the locally-owned businesses, many of which call restored cottages along Historic Main Street home.

EAT

When it's time for lunch, try The Cheddar Box Café, Cottage Café or Plump Peacock Bakery & Café. If you're in the mood for pizza, there is Coals Artisan Pizza, Hometown Pizza and Wick's Pizza Parlor. For BBQ, stop by the local favorite, Mark's Feed Store. Travel the world via your taste buds with Clay Oven Indian Restaurant, Havana Rumba (Cuban), MASA Japanese Bistro & Sushi Bar and Simply Thai.

DISCOVER

You'll find trails, a nature center, picnic areas, a fishing lake, playground and sprayground at Buckley Creek Park.

Visit Middletown Historical Museum and learn about the early days of the neighborhood through political posters, furniture, quilts and military uniforms.

Unleash your inner racecar driver year-around at Renaissance Fun Park. And test your golfing skills at one of the two mini golf courses. There's also laser tag and an arcade with more than 30 games.

SHOP

Along Middletown's Historic Main Street, there's a treasure trove of shops and boutiques to treat yourself or buy a unique souvenir. Chick A D's, Prickly Pear Boutique, and Tunie's carry women's accessories and home décor. If you love the sparkle of Swarovski crystals, stop by Lin Z's Boutique, where the crystals are combined with gemstones to create little works of art. Moss Hill Bath & Body Collection of handmade soaps, lotions, body scrubs and more are perfect when you need pampering. A bargain can be found at women's apparel shops Judy's Finest Consignments and The Wright Stuff Consignment Shop. A Little Bit of Bybee Pottery shows the artistry of the Cornelison family, who have made stoneware since 1809.

The options don't end there. A Taste of Kentucky is your one-stop for all things Kentucky. If flea markets are more your style, stop by Middletown Peddlers Mall. Where more than 300 vendors sell antiques, crafts, home décor and jewelry. There's more than antique furniture at Red Barn Antique & Art Emporium. You'll find vintage clothes, jewelry and one-of-a-kind collectibles. Middletown Commons is home to national retailers and restaurants as well as locally owned BoomBozz Craft Pizza & Taphouse, The Comfy Cow and Yang Kee Noodle.

DUTHERN INDIANA

Southern Indiana, just a mile north of Louisville, is a quick hop over the bridge from downtown and has charming riverfront communities with revitalized, walkable downtowns, historical attractions and upand-coming restaurants.

NEW ALBANY


In New Albany, you'll find great coffee shops, stylish boutiques (like Dress & Dwell), a beloved local brewery (The New Albanian Brewing Co.) and a hoppin' winery (River City Winery). The dining scene is also top notch. Head to Feast BBQ for Bourbon and slow-smoked brisket or Dragon King's Daughter for an Asian-fusion experience. Craft beer fans, stop by local brewers New Albanian's Public House and Pizzeria, where you can choose from a selection of its brews and those from around the world, and Floyd County Brewing, serving 6 of its own beers and ales and 4 guest brews with an English pub-inspired menu. For art and history lovers, there's Carnegie Center For Art & History. Or, take a tour of historic Culbertson Mansion, which tells the story of an influential dry goods merchant, one of Indiana's richest men. Have a family-friendly good time at River Run New Albany Family Waterpark.

JEFFERSONVILLE

A short one-mile stroll or bike ride across the Big Four Bridge will land you in Jeffersonville and at the Big Four Station, featuring green space, fountains, a pavilion and a playground. Grab a bite at Big Four Burgers & Beer, kick back with a locally-crafted beer at Red Yeti, or head down to Schimpff's one of the oldest, continuously operated, familyowned candy businesses in the U.S. Take a step back in time to the Great Steamboat era with a tour of the Howard Steamboat Museum, a treasure trove of photographs, paintings, half-hull models and other artifacts.

CLARKSVILLE

Clarksville is home to the Falls of the Ohio State Park, where the 390-million-year-old exposed fossil beds steal the show (the Falls was the site where famous explorers Lewis & Clark met up for their expedition). The Falls of the Ohio Interpretive Center recently underwent a \$6 million renovation and features new exhibits with state-of-the-art audio, video and interactive elements. Also, the George Rogers Clark home site is located at the lower end of the Falls of The Ohio. Known for almost 200 years as "Clark's Point," it's situated in a sharp curve enabling a spectacular view of the Falls and the river. Be entertained at Derby Dinner Playhouse, one of the oldest and largest continually operating professional dinner theatres in the country.



OTHER MUST-SEE SPOTS

Just 20 minutes west of Louisville is Horseshoe Southern Indiana - a riverboat casino that hosts concerts and has 8 restaurants, the Envy nightclub, Chariot Run Golf Course and 502 hotel rooms.

Enjoy country-style dinners, children's play areas, a farmers market and a gift shop at Joe Huber's Family Farm & Restaurant in Starlight. Huber's Orchard, Winery and Vineyard is a farm-based winery and distillery open year-round. The U-Pick operation has something for every season.



Louisville



DRIVING

Louisville is located between St. Louis and Cincinnati on the banks of the scenic 981-mile-long Ohio River. At the northern edge of the South and the southern edge of the Midwest, Louisville's central location puts it within a day's drive of half of the nation's population. At the intersection of three major interstates – I-64, $I-71 \ and \ I-65-the \ city \ is \ directly \ connected \ to \ such \ communities \ as \ Indianapolis, \ Cincinnati, \ Nashville, \ St.$ Louis, Chicago, Columbus, Cleveland and Birmingham.



You'll know you've arrived in Bourbon Country when you step into Louisville International Airport. Savor a bite to eat or a sip of Bourbon at the Woodford Reserve Bar & Grill. Head up to the $Bourbon\ Loft\ to\ kick\ back\ with\ a\ cocktail\ while\ enjoying\ a\ view\ of\ the\ city.\ Remember\ your\ visit\ with$ Louisville-themed souvenirs from the airport's Churchill Downs and Louisville Slugger gift shops.

FLYING

Louisville International Airport (SDF) is just 7 miles (10 minutes) from downtown. Serviced by nearly every major and regional airline, the airport offers non-stop or connecting service to hundreds of destinations around the world. For current flight information, visit www.flylouisville.com.

Taxi fare from the airport to downtown is regulated by Metro Government. As of January 2016, the rate is \$19.55. (The rate can fluctuate with rising gas prices). Up to four people can ride at that rate; each additional passenger is \$3.



GETTING AROUND

ZeroBuses operate on Fourth Street from 7AM to 7PM and on Main and Market streets from 7AM to 8PM weekdays. Buses run on both routes from IOAM to 6PM Saturdays.

Louisville is an easy city to navigate. In addition to the three major interstates -I-64, I-71 and I-65 – there are two beltways that make a ring around the city.

Taxi service is available 24 hours a day. For fast, effortless transportation in and around the Louisville area, the Transit Authority of River City (TARC) offers bus service throughout the day and evening.

TARC also operates the ZeroBus Free Downtown Circulator. The all-electric, zero-emissions buses provide complimentary rides for passengers in downtown Louisville along Main, Market and Fourth Streets. (Louisville is the first city in this part of the country to have a fleet of all-electric buses in operation.)

For more information about the ZeroBus routes, attractions in the downtown area and real-time tracking, download the free ZeroBus app from the iTunes App Store or Google Play.

DOWNTOWN PARKING

There are almost 60,000 parking spaces in downtown Louisville – from garage and surface lots to 5,000 on-street spaces.

All parking meters accept coins, and some have solar-powered meters that accept all four major credit cards. The pay-by-cell option is accepted at all parking meters. Customers can register for free from a mobile phone by downloading the app. Or, call 502.785.7230 or visit www.passportparking.com.

DOWNTOWN WALKING TOURS

Louisville prides itself on being a very walkable city. The Louisville Visitors Center (301 S. 4th St.) offers free Downtown Walking Tours seasonally. The guided tours cover 10 blocks and last between 75 and 90 minutes.

- · Architecture on historic Main Street, including the American Life Building and Humana Building
- · Belvedere and Ohio River
- · Kentucky Center for the Performing Arts
- Museum Row
- Civic District





In September 2012, the Speed Art Museum, which first opened in 1927 as the J.B. Speed Memorial Museum, closed its doors to begin a nearly four-year, \$50+ million renovation.

The new re-imagined Speed, as designed by Kulapt Yantrasast of Los Angeles-based architecture and design firm wHY, opened its doors in Spring 2016 and is a blend of both the old and modern. It features the original building from 1927 along with the two new buildings.

With the renovation, Kentucky's largest and oldest museum, led by Speed CEO Ghislain d'Humières, is now approximately 220,000 square feet, and includes the new North and South Buildings and an outdoor art park and piazza. The reopening also brings five site-specific commissioned works inspired by the state's heritage and art. When you're ready for a bite to eat, visit the café, the Wiltshire at the Speed. Need a guide? The Speed has two options: A docent-led tour or a virtual guide via mobile app.





I. THE NORTH BUILDING

Acting as the main entrance to the Speed, this is where your journey into the world of art begins. Constructed with 400 glass panels embedded with silver metallic pieces, the building magically allows visitors to see outside and deflects harsh sunlight, which protects the artwork. Natural light, the use of glass on the staircase and the surrounding reflective pools combine to create an inviting place with unobstructed views inside and out. Climb the "floating" staircase to start your tour with the contemporary art gallery or the temporary exhibition space. Be sure and look for Spencer Finch's hanging sculpture homage to Abraham Lincoln. The work recreates the sunrise of February 12, 1809, the date of Lincoln's birth in Hodgenville, Ky.





OUTDOOR ART PARK AND PUBLIC PIAZZA

At the Speed, the art isn't just confined to the indoors. The Elizabeth P. and Frederick K. Cressman Art Park and public piazza is a must-stop. The open-air works include Mark Handforth's "Wishbone" and Henry Moore's "Reclining Figure: Angles." Best of all, the art park and its accompanying water features and green space are free and open to the public. So go ahead, be inspired while enjoying the great outdoors and maybe even order a picnic lunch from the café.

THE SPEED CINEMA

Love American independent and international films? Be sure to take in a showing at the Speed Cinema. The 142-seat cinema is equipped with state-of-theart projection systems to screen films in 16mm, 35mm and digital. Curated films (running the gamut from art house, experimental and children's flicks) are scheduled for Friday through Sunday. Showings aren't limited to the cinema either; outdoor screenings are on the schedule too.

ART SPARKS

Ignite your family's creativity with a visit to Art Sparks. In the open and flexible space, both adults and children can connect with the artwork in the Speed's collection, as well as with each other through the 15 hands-on learning stations. The exhibits focus on the themes of Noticing, Making and Talking About Art. For the younger set, there's Planet Preschool, which engages the imaginations of children five years old and younger.

EXHIBITIONS

Discover the wide range of artistic techniques from more than 6,000 years of history throughout the renovated galleries. Visit the expanded Kentucky Gallery, which includes paintings and decorative art from 1800–1945. Temporary and visiting exhibitions bring the finest and most intriguing art to Louisville. Exhibitions in 2016 include a virtual trip throughout the state via the camera's eye ("Kentucky Captured: Photographs Inspired by the Bluegrass State"); the solo exhibition ("Gaela Erwin"), a Louisville-based artist featuring Speed-commissioned portraits in pastel; and a national traveling exhibit featuring the popular footwear, the sneaker ("Out of the Box: The Rise of the Sneaker Culture").

MUSEUM SHOP

Souvenir hunters with an artistic flair will find iewelry, scarves, housewares and more from local artists and craftspeople in the museum shop (located in the North Building). For budding artists, the store offers art books, art supplies and educational toys to inspire and encourage creativity.
